



FROM THE PRESIDENT

Great show, thanks to us

The 35th Annual Coin Show and Sale was well attended and, once again, many members contributed to its success. See the article by Bill Coe and the list of participants in this issue. We especially appreciate Bill's efforts; he "put it all together." Also, thanks to Joe Lanzafame and his committee (Scott, David, Darlene, Tim, Bill and Ted) for developing the wooden nickel with its theme, "The RNA Gratefully Honors Bill Coe." I know the dealers appreciate the lunches arranged by the Kemps, Richard Imburgia and crew.

Exhibits were all high quality and interesting. Congratulations to Ken Traub for his best-in-show display of rare Canadian notes and currency. The exhibit by RJNA members included their favorite coins and write-ups about them. Each RJNA participant received a certificate at their November meeting. Thank you, Tom Kraus, for leading this project and providing the certificates. The junior club members had both a table and materials to sell at the show thanks to the generous donation of Richard Nachbar, whose present and past support is sincerely appreciated.

One more note about our 2000th meeting on September 6 concerns the exhibit of nonpresidential medals created by Tom Kraus. It included, among others, examples of our speakers and writers medals; the anniversary medals from years 50, 60, 70, 75, and 90; the 1000th and 2000th meetings; and the RJNA medals. Tom is now helping members of RJNA design a new wooden nickel. Thanks, Tom (and Maureen), for your continued support of the junior club.

Special events and exhibits, our annual banquet and the annual picnic (as well as our regular meetings) are only some of the benefits of RNA membership. There is nothing like being there in person to interact with fellow members, hear an off-the-cuff explanation of a complex numismatic issue, learn of a new die variety or see an expert presentation about a set of coins in its historical context.

During the coin show, a lady from eastern New York State brought in a

large framed photo of the 1917 Rochester ANA Convention attendees. John Stephens purchased the photo and immediately donated it to our club. (Photo on page 5.) Thank you, John.

Other donations in 2007 include two books donated by Peter Blaisdell, Treasury of Jewish Coins by Ya'akov Meshorer, and Samarian Coinage by Meshorer and Qedar; the new 4th Edition of Early Half Dollar Die Varieties, 1794-1836, by Don Parsley, donated by John Stephens; and auction materials donated by Bill Carr, Peter Blaisdell and Gerry Muhl. Thanks to all who sent in donations with their dues payments as well.

On December 6, members endorsed a proposed bylaws change. The change, printed on page 7 of this RNA News, establishes Board of Directors oversight of RNA Collection acquisition and disposal, and recognizes the position of Assistant Curator (which up to now has been unofficial while ably filled by Gerry Muhl). A copy of the most recent version of our bylaws is posted on our Web site. A vote on the change is scheduled for the February 7 meeting.

As I conclude this letter on the shortest day of the year, I wonder what the future holds for RNA and our numismatic hobby. Do we expect coin and precious metals prices to continue to rise, without correction, into the foreseeable future? Will Heritage auction another newly minted MS70 Lincoln cent for \$39,000? What lessons can we learn from past excesses in the marketplace?

As for our club, I believe the future remains bright as long as we continue to provide a varied program that meets the needs of numismatists and the challenge of a changing hobby environment. RNA has members near and far, from California to New Jersey and from New York to Florida. Thank you for your continued support, and best wishes for 2008 and beyond.

Notice of proposed RNA bylaws change

December 6, 2007

Proposed change to By Laws, Article V, Officers, Section 4, in order to require Board approval for accession or deaccession of numismatic collection materials, and to add the non-voting position of Assistant Curator.

Current text: Section 4.

(e) Curator. It shall be the duty of the Curator to have sole custody and keep an accurate account of the Association's numismatic collection and its physical possessions other than the library and to arrange and care for its display. He shall report as to the condition of the collection annually or as often as shall be required of him by the Association or by the Board of Directors.

Proposed text (underlined text is new): Section 4.

(e) Curator. It shall be the duty of the Curator to have sole custody and keep an accurate account of the Association's numismatic collection and its physical possessions other than the library and to arrange and care for its display. He shall report as to the condition of the collection annually or as often as shall be required of him by the Association or by the Board of Directors. Accession or deaccession of numismatic collection materials may be recommended by the Curator or Association members, and shall be approved or denied by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

(f) Assistant Curator. Annually, the Curator may appoint one or more members as Assistant Curator to assist in the performance of the Curator's duties. The Assistant Curator may have access to the collection with the permission of the Curator, and shall have no vote on the Board of Directors. The Assistant Curator shall take office only when approved by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, for a term concurrent and ending with that of the Curator, unless earlier termination be made by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. A reappointed Assistant Curator may continue in office pending a vote at the next meeting of the Board of Directors. A copy of the appointment (reappointment) letter shall be forwarded to the Secretary.

(g) Librarian. Former section (f) is re-designated section (g).

Dates in RNA History

January 2, 1940: Honorary RNA member Congressman Ashbrook dies.

January 6, 1940: RNA banquet at Hotel Seneca costs \$1.25. Festivities started at 3 p.m., with dinner at 6:30 p.m. followed by slides and an auction. It ended at 11 p.m.

January 16, 1940: Mr. Peake sells Scottish coins to the RNA.

January 4, 1946: ANA President Lewis Reagan speaks at the RNA banquet.

January 15, 1946: RNA votes to add current-year U.S. coins to its collection each year.

January 4, 1947: The 35th Anniversary RNA medal is struck.

January 21, 1947: Forty-eight youth from ages 12 to 17 organize the RJNA. Ed Meinhart is chairman; Charles Ricard is program chairman.

January 3, 1948: RJNA has more than 50 members. C.E. Moore is made an RNA Life Member.

January 25, 1949: Mr. Place is made an honorary member of the RNA.

January 7, 1950: Ed Gilroy speaks on the danger of communism at the RNA banquet.

January 2, 1954: Charles Cop gives a half-hour magic show at the RNA banquet.

January 1, 1955: Arthur Parker, RNA President in 1928, dies.

January 7, 1956: Annual banquet has piano and violin program. Norman Prince leads singing. A. Kolb presents a two-scene play. Attendance numbers 116. Brandy and cigars follow.

February 4, 1940: George Bauer holds first sale of RNA member George Gillette's 20,000-item coin collection.

February 4, 1941: Gustave Lindboe made "fellow of the Rochester Museum" in numismatics.

February 18, 1941: Caledonia and Buffalo coin clubs meet with the RNA in Batavia.

February 17, 1942: RNA secretary orders seven proof sets from mint for members at \$13.30 each. RNA orders 10 copies of R.S. Yeoman's first-edition *Whitman Handbook of U.S. Coins*. Charles Ricard applies for junior membership in RNA.

February 4, 1947: RNA purchases complete set of *American Journal of Numismatics* for \$175. It is noted that Booker T. Washington half-dollars are sitting in a local bank. Iowa commemoratives are still available. J. Pittman appointed to Federal Assay Commission.

February 7, 1949: A. Kolb asked to destroy past RNA dies so restrikes will not be made. Club votes down motion.

February 6, 1950: RJNA works on a radio show script. They design new logo. Anyone leaving for military allowed to keep RNA membership. Charles Ricard leaves for military service.

February 2 1954: George Bauer leaves for Rome to buy coins. John J. Pittman heads for King Farouk coin sale in Egypt.

February 1, 1955: RNA donates \$25 to museum to buy land where planetarium now sits.
